Frindsbury Extra Parish Council has considered this application. Members ask that the application goes forward to Medway Council's Planning Committee for determination. The current operation on the site is causing problems with lorries exiting the site and spilling materials onto the road, which the Council understands is costing Medway Council a considerable amount to clear up. We believe the applicant says that these lorries are not under their control and that they have no responsibility, but members believe this could be controlled by the imposition of suitable conditions. In addition, members were unable to estimate the height of the proposed silos from the drawings and are concerned about their possible impact on the opposite bank of the river.

#### **MEDWAY COUNCILLORS' REPORTS**

The Chairman suspended the meeting to enable Cllrs Etheridge, Hicks and Williams give their report.

Cllr Etheridge reported that enforcement orders had been placed on trucks in Higham Road and on an advertising van near the Sans Pareil roundabout. He referred to the local plan. Medway had the lowest gross value added (productivity in the area) in Kent as most people worked and spent out of the area. A high value income was needed in Medway. Cllr Hicks said a meeting on the Local Plan for parish councillors would be held on 17<sup>th</sup> January at Gun Wharf and members should be aware of the potential of development at Cliffe and on the Hoo Peninsula, as traffic for any developments would be going through the parish. Cllr Williams objected to building at Cliffe due to the lack of infrastructure. A dead horse had been found on a footpath in Cliffe. The Chairman said that his wife was on a committee that usually met in Maidstone but occasionally met at Gun Wharf. The barrier had been down and she and another committee member had been refused entry. He asked Cllrs Etheridge, Hicks and Williams to take this up.

The Chairman thanked the three ward councillors and reconvened the meeting.
